#### **1. Outline progress over the last 6 months (April – September) against the agreed project implementation timetable (if your project started less than 6 months ago, please report on the period since start up to end of September).**

Specimens collected in Y1 by our partners Myles Darrell (Bermuda National Trust) and Mark Outerbridge (Bermuda Government), supplemented with help from talented local high school students, has resulted in a good collection of invertebrates being amassed for Bermuda, which are now in the UK and undergoing identification. Similarly, our partners on the Falklands plus a contractor have collected specimens, now in the UK which are also now sent for identification. Over 3000 specimens collected in Anguilla during Y1 have now been identified, including over 1000 specimens by the Project Manager Danni Sherwood (expert arachnologist), and 2000 specimens by a freelance entomologist. Several scientific papers are in progress with local partners.

Anguilla and the Falklands have received training courses on general ecology and conservation, through workshops led by Danni Sherwood and Vicky Wilkins (Species Recovery Trust), these sessions were held virtually and well-received, and follow up questionnaires were send out on 31st October.

The project continues to collect and analyse records from iNaturalist and has now engaged local users on Anguilla, Bermuda, and the Falklands, with plans to further expand usage through promotion to the public.

A major achievement is that the methodology for Important Invertebrate Areas (IIAs) has now been perfected for small islands and all Ascension Island mapping and IIAs now completed. With this methodology, which will be written up into a scientific paper with local colleagues, we will now be able to start the process for other islands. The next island to receive IIA analysis will be Bermuda, in December 2025, followed by the Falklands and Anguilla in early Y3.

A lesson learnt was that the ease of collecting and richness of samples varied on each island, meaning we had to modify our approach in a custom way for each island. We have managed therefore to get good samples from all three islands where this was required. In future though, we now know that approaches may need to vary with each island to ensure maximum results.
